DISASTERS AND EMERGENCIES: IN CANADA

On average, the Canadian Red Cross assisted 40 INDIVIDUALS DAILY who were impacted by a personal disaster, such as a house fire

Over 1,050 PERSONNEL deployed in support of 21 medium and large-scale responses

Over \$81 MILLION provided in financial assistance to more than 28,400 HOUSEHOLDS impacted by disasters and emergencies in Canada

12 RECOVERY OPERATIONS supported

11,000+ HOUSEHOLDS supported through case management, including housing repair, reconstruction assistance and mitigation

Over 55,000 PEOPLE in Canada supported through registering with the Red Cross after an emergency

2,600+ PEOPLE participated in **Disaster Preparedness Workshops**

Provided over 19,700 RELIEF ITEMS to assist people impacted by a disaster or emergency, such as cots, blankets, teddy bears, hygiene kits, and other essential items

2,046 COMMUNITY **ORGANIZATIONS** supported following or in preparedness for disruptive events, this includes support to 69 organizations related to mental health, and 74 organizations supported for disaster risk and

314.000+ PIECES OF HEALTH **EQUIPMENT loaned** (walkers, wheelchairs, crutches, etc.)

235,000+ MEALS delivered to those unable to prepare their own food so they can live independently

904,000+ PEOPLE trained in First Aid and CPR

105,000+ RIDES provided to those unable to use public transportation or private means

67,000+ FRIENDLY CALLS made with people who may benefit from increased access to regular emotional support, social interaction, enhanced coping skills, and community connections

97 COMMUNITY WELLNESS and **PROTECTION EDUCATION** WORKSHOPS provided to encourage supportive relationships, life promotion, and positive communication strategies

13 PERSONNEL (including clinical, and public health specialists) deployed to 6 DIFFERENT OPERATIONS

5 PUBLIC HEALTH SPECIALISTS

deployed to provide support to refugee and asylum seekers

More than 1,800 MIGRANTS supported by Red Cross health representatives, allowing migrants to navigate the Canadian health system and obtain health services, including provision of health information and resources, as well as over 1,300 **REFERRALS** provided to **connect** migrants with health resources

4 CLINICAL SPECIALISTS and 2 INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL **GRADUATES** deployed to **provide** essential clinical support and outbreak management in northern, remote and Indigenous Communities
