## Our Work in Canada and Around the World

### ORGANIZATIONAL CAPACITY

**14,100+** active volunteers (including Ready When the Time Comes + other partnerships)

**2,400+** employees (including full-time, part-time and casual staff, rapid responders, and delegates)

### DISASTERS AND EMERGENCIES: IN CANADA

On average, the Canadian Red Cross assisted **37 INDIVIDUALS DAILY** who were **impacted by a personal disaster**, such as a house fire

**1,400+ PERSONNEL** deployed in support of **20 medium- and large-scale responses**

**More than \$45 MILLION** provided in **financial assistance** to nearly **53,000 INDIVIDUALS** impacted by disasters and emergencies in Canada

**13 RECOVERY OPERATIONS** supported

**11,500+ HOUSEHOLDS** supported through **case management**, including housing repair, reconstruction assistance and mitigation

**93,500+ PEOPLE** in Canada supported through **registering** with the Red Cross after an emergency

**1568 HOUSEHOLDS** reached with **preparedness activities**

**314 SMALL BUSINESSES** supported with **recovery efforts**

Provided **68,900+ RELIEF ITEMS** to **assist people impacted by a disaster or emergency**, such as cots, blankets, teddy bears, hygiene kits, and other essential items

**131 GRANTS** were issued to **Community Organizations** following or in preparedness for disruptive events, this includes **24 grants related to mental health**, and **45 grants for disaster risk and reduction**

### DISASTERS AND EMERGENCIES: GLOBAL CONTRIBUTIONS

**More than \$67 MILLION** provided in support of **global Red Cross Red Crescent efforts**, including to:

- Hurricane Melissa in **Jamaica, Cuba, and Dominican Republic**, with an emergency clinic operating in Jamaica
- a Red Cross Field Hospital in **Gaza**
- adolescent health programming in **Mali**
- ongoing humanitarian support in **Ukraine** and impacted countries
- support to **Philippines** Cebu Earthquake and Typhoons, and support to combat the Ebola outbreak in the **Democratic Republic of the Congo** (DRC) as well as numerous local responses to small- and medium-sized emergencies

**93 HUMANITARIAN EXPERTS** deployed to assist in **28 COUNTRIES**, including Jamaica, DRC, and Ivory Coast

**44,405 EMERGENCY STOCK ITEMS** mobilized such as blankets, buckets, menstrual health and hygiene kits, solar lamps and shelter tool kits to support the **immediate needs** of people impacted by **Hurricane Melissa** in Jamaica and Cuba, **Venezuela floods**, and an **earthquake in the Philippines**

**65 PROGRAMS** operated in **35 COUNTRIES** supporting local Red Cross Red Crescent National Societies to implement **preparedness, resilience and recovery activities**

Canadian Red Cross international **emergency health services** supported **6 EMERGENCY HEALTH OPERATIONS**, including mobile clinic support in **Myanmar and Afghanistan**, infection prevention and community-based surveillance support in **DRC**, medical items for **Cuba**, a health clinic in **Jamaica**, and personnel and Safe and Dignified Burial kits in **Ethiopia**

## HEALTH: COMMUNITY HEALTH AND PREVENTION IN CANADA

**330,427 PIECES OF HEALTH EQUIPMENT** loaned (walkers, wheelchairs, crutches, etc.)

**242,231 MEALS** delivered to those unable to prepare their own food so they can live independently

**958,933 PEOPLE** trained in First Aid and CPR

**103,711 RIDES** provided to those unable to use public transportation or private means

**114,783 CONTACTS** made with people who may benefit from increased access to **regular emotional support, social interaction, enhanced coping skills, and community connections**

**110 WORKSHOPS** supporting **community wellness and prevention** through education and skill-building

**654,560 POUNDS** of food packed into hampers and **provided to those unable to access walk-in food banks**

**909 VOLUNTEERS** from corporate partnerships engaged **to pack and prepare food hampers for families** experiencing food insecurity

**6,586 HOURS** spent managing complex health and social needs **for individuals transitioning home from hospital** or at risk of unnecessary readmission

**178 EVENTS** held in **Indigenous communities and First Nations** to bring Elders and community members together for social activities

## HEALTH: IN EMERGENCIES

**31 PERSONNEL** (including clinical, and public health specialists), **74 DEPLOYMENTS**, in **10 DIFFERENT OPERATIONS**

**5 PUBLIC HEALTH SPECIALISTS** deployed to **provide high-quality health support to refugee and asylum seeker claimants** in Canada

**Over 120 MIGRANTS** supported by **Red Cross health representatives** in Ontario, and virtually across Canada, to navigate the Canadian health system and obtain health services, including **provision of health information and resources**, as well as more than **70 health resources** provided

**8 CLINICAL SPECIALISTS** and **3 INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL GRADUATES** deployed to **provide essential clinical support and outbreak management** in northern, remote and Indigenous Communities

## COLLABORATING WITH INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES

**127 INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES** and organizations **supported by the Indigenous Programs team** in response to the needs identified by communities while building on community strengths and resources in the areas of health promotion, disaster risk management, community wellness and protection, and injury prevention

**51 COMMUNITY CONSULTATIONS** provided through **Indigenous Programs**

**21 TOOLS/RESOURCES** developed or adapted by the **Indigenous Programs team** to support community wellness, preparedness, and resilience

**20 FORMAL REFERRALS** to external **services or agencies** shared directly with Indigenous communities to provide additional assistance and support

**44 COMMUNITIES** supported with **evacuations** from flood and fires across **3 provinces**

**550 PEOPLE** participated in **drowning prevention courses** and **swimming lessons**
