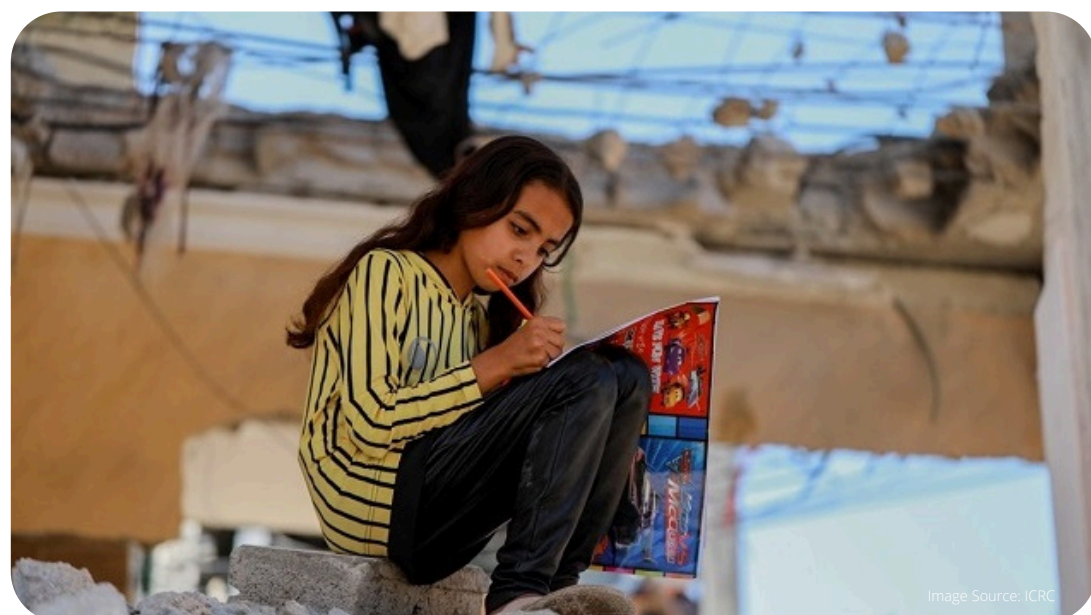

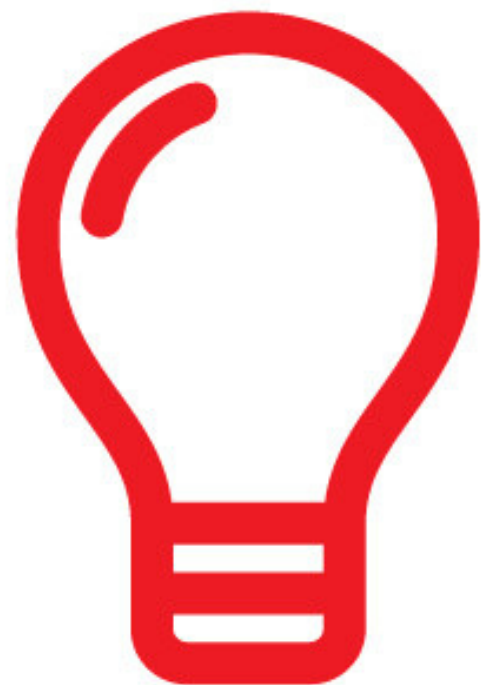
Network with subject matter experts, including International Humanitarian Law (IHL) legal experts, international humanitarian practitioners, and teachers across the province representing a range of subjects.

ABOUT THE WORKSHOPS



The Canadian Red Cross (CRC) aims to create a culture in Canada that values and understands International Humanitarian Law (IHL) and humanitarian principles by increasing access to quality humanitarian education teacher trainings. We've organized a train the trainers approach to make humanitarian education trainings more accessible to teachers across the province of British Columbia. This 2-day professional development opportunity for high school teachers takes place February 28th and March 1st, 2025 at the Canadian Red Cross office in Burnaby. Among those who register, approximately 15 teachers from across British Columbia will be selected to participate. Bursaries for travel and other expenses are available upon request.

- New resources to help your students think critically about issues related to armed conflict
- A facilitator's handbook to bring professional development on International Humanitarian Law (IHL) to teachers in your school district
- The opportunity to design a training model appropriate to your region
- Hear from leading experts in the field who will support your regional trainings as facilitators
- Instant access to a network of humanitarian educators
- Follow-up support from CRC staff to implement a training for teachers in your region

WHAT WE ASK:

- You're available for a 90 minute online pre-training orientation session in January 2025 (in the evening), and can attend both days of the in-person training in Feb 28th & March 1st in addition to an online follow-up session
- You've participated in a CRC humanitarian education training in the past, OR you've prepared to strengthen your skills in IHL using our available resources prior to the winter workshops
- You've explored the use of CRC materials to implement IHL activities in your classroom prior to the training (materials include Exploring Humanitarian Law toolkit, the Canada & Conflict manual, Humanitarian Education Curriculum Guidebook, or the ForcedtoFight.ca interactive website)
- You're scheduled to teach within your school district for the next 2 years minimum (not retired)
- You're able to commit to hosting a Humanitarian Education training for teachers at your school district in the 2025-26 school year with the support of another teacher from your school district and the CRC
