

Libya Floods Appeal

DONOR UPDATE - AUGUST 2024



Dear Supporter,

Last year Storm Daniel struck and caused massive flooding, which devastated the lives of 1.2 million people in north-eastern Libya. Overwhelmed by floodwaters, dams in Derna collapsed, leading to the surge that destroyed the port city and its surrounding communities.

The Libyan Red Crescent Society teams responded swiftly and in a coordinated manner immediately after the disaster to meet the urgent needs of people impacted by the floods. They helped people evacuate their homes, provided first aid and conducted search and rescue efforts with limited resources.

Thanks to your compassion, the Canadian Red Cross was able to send a team of humanitarian experts and supplies to help our local partners provide critical support on the ground after this large-scale disaster.

Families continue to grapple with the aftermath of losing their loved ones and their homes. As those who were displaced gradually return to their communities, they face lack of access to essential services due to the destruction of critical infrastructure, including roads, power and communication networks, and water and sewage systems. This disaster took an extreme toll on people living in Libya, and the need for humanitarian aid continues. Your gift means that the people of Libya can rebuild their lives.

It is with thanks to the generosity and compassion of donors like you that the Red Cross and Red Crescent will continue to support those affected by this disaster.

Supporting People in Libya After Storm Daniel

The Humanitarian Situation*

When Storm Daniel hit north-eastern Libya, the Libyan Red Crescent Society staff and more than 730 volunteers responded immediately with emergency support, such as search and rescue, first aid and distribution of essential humanitarian supplies.

Since the onset of this disaster, Libyan Red Crescent Society teams have provided humanitarian aid to more than 130,000 people. They also established a central emergency operation room in Benghazi and two temporary centres in Eastern and Western Derna.

The Libyan Red Crescent Society continues to work tirelessly to reunite families, establish a database for missing people, deliver essential supplies and provide psychological support to affected people, including Red Cross Red Crescent personnel on the frontlines.

People in Libya continue to struggle with the destruction caused by the flood surges. Markets, shops and local businesses along the riverbank were destroyed. Families continue to be displaced after losing their homes, and are battling the absence of stable shelter, clean water, and essential sanitation facilities even upon the return to their communities. The people living in Libya face a long road to recovery.

Your Generosity in Action

Your generosity, along with donations from the Temerty Foundation and Global Affairs Canada enabled the Canadian Red Cross to send humanitarian experts and materials to Libya to provide aid in the areas of relief and mental health and psychosocial support. This includes supporting local volunteers in their activities and programming for the mental health and well-being of the many children impacted by the floods.

The team worked closely with the Libyan Red Crescent Society (LRCS) to provide these services, and the materials will remain in Libya for future use.


