



2018 Tornadoes in Outaouais: Financial Assistance for those affected

Financial assistance, provided at the household level, is available to homeowners and tenants:

- › who are **registered** with the Red Cross;
- › whose residence is located in **the disaster area** (as confirmed by the authorities);
- › who primary residence **has been destroyed or rendered uninhabitable** as a result of major damage;
 - OR whose primary residence has sustained minor damage;
 - OR who need financial assistance as a result of being unable to return home.

*Relocation and utilities assistance may be renewed according to needs and funds available to the Red Cross.

**Exceptional humanitarian assistance aims to address specific or ad hoc needs that, if unmet, could adversely affect the beneficiary's recovery.

Financial assistance will be provided in the form of electronic funds transfers or prepaid cards to homeowners or tenants, depending on the type of assistance.
