

"Once you see a camel is dead, then you know you are heading towards famine," says Fatuma Idris, a Senior Health Officer at the Somali Red Crescent Society.

Even these resilient animals are casualties of a drought that has gripped parts of East Africa – a crisis that has starved livestock and emptied wells.

Six months ago, the world was awakening to a looming human catastrophe. Across several countries, millions of people faced life threatening hunger due to a severe food crisis caused by drought and crisis.

The consequences have been devastating. Farming stopped. Livelihoods lost. Families left without enough to eat or drink.

"Before we used to sow maize but for more than a year, there has been no rain, so no cultivation," says Abebech Ayanu, a young mother in Ethiopia. "Some of my livestock have already died. My children are now starving and there is no water."

But drought has not just caused thirst and hunger. It has also caused disease to spread. When supply is scarce, water from dirty rivers and contaminated sources is often the only option for desperate families. Those who are malnourished are more vulnerable to infection and more likely to perish from preventable diseases like cholera.

But thanks to donors like you, emergency help has arrived to those most in need. Families whose crops and livestock have perished can plant and secure food again. People can access clean water safely without travelling through conflict zones. And mothers can find life-saving treatment for their sick or malnourished children.

While the situation remains critical across the region, your support continues to bring vital relief to people facing an incredible challenge to their survival.

#### ETHIOPIA

In Ethiopia, some regions have not seen rain in more than two years. Your support is restoring access to water, reducing the risk of disease, and helping to protect families' means of income. "This sickness is not the same as when they have been sick in the past...I am worried that my own children will die," says Shukri. The cholera that ravaged so many drought-stricken villages in Somaliland had taken a toll on two of her three children.

"When I heard about the treatment centre opened up by the Red Cross, I had to find a way to get my children there," says Shukri.

Shukri's six-year-old boy, Zakaria, was lucky. He arrived at the centre so weak he was barely able to lift his head. But just hours later, the rehydration solution given to Zakaria was enough to restore his energy and fight off the disease.

The care found inside the Red Cross hospital tents has come from the actions of our donors. Your kindness has brought life-saving medications and the skill and heart of a dedicated team of Canadian medical professionals working alongside local doctors and nurses.


