



Ukraine Humanitarian Support in Canada

The sight of the Red Cross emblem has been a welcome comfort for many people arriving in Canada who have been displaced by the armed conflict in Ukraine.

Forced to leave everything behind, many Ukrainians arriving in Canada brought with them only what they could pack in a suitcase.

The Canadian Red Cross partnered with the Government of Canada, provincial governments and community organizations to provide support services to those fleeing the conflict upon their arrival at Canadian airports.

Many of the those who arrived were in vulnerable situations and required additional support, including the elderly, people living with disabilities, or parents with children. **It is here the strength and compassion of donors like you truly made a difference.**

Your donation provided tailored support and financial assistance to over 1,500 Ukrainian arrivals who required urgent, additional help with accommodation, food, and other basic needs such as referral services, psychosocial support, and connecting people with their loved ones. In addition, the Canadian Red Cross will provide granting funds to qualified community organizations who will provide longer-term settlement support to Ukrainian arrivals.

Bringing Experience and Understanding to Support Arrivals

Wajid Mughal understands the fear and hardship of having to leave your home country to start again in a foreign place. Before coming to Canada four years ago, Wajid saw the incredible impact of the Canadian Red Cross as they responded to a devastating earthquake in his hometown in the northern region of Pakistan in 2005.

Today, Wajid lives in Canada and has joined the Canadian Red Cross as a volunteer who is committed to give back and help others. Wajid has supported people affected by wildfires in Northern Ontario, flooding in Manitoba, at a COVID-19 vaccination clinic in Ontario, and most recently he supported arrivals fleeing the conflict in Ukraine.

“I can feel this pain because I went through this and when somebody is in trouble or is in pain—I’m going out to help,” he explains.

Some of those people who were welcomed and comforted by Canadian Red Cross personnel were Ivanna and her daughter Anichka.
