Main points regarding

cultural awareness

- Effective communication between people of different cultures can present a challenge. Culture is based on a number of factors that influence how we think, see, hear and interpret the world.
- The same words can have an entirely different meaning when used by people of different cultures. Moreover, body language often speaks as loudly as what we say, if not louder. Be very aware of your gestures, posture and facial expressions.
- · Avoid familiarity, jokes and remarks that could be considered offensive and put you in an embarrassing situation.
