

ONE YEAR DONOR UPDATE

ONE YEAR AGO, HAITI, which was still struggling to recover from the devastating earthquake in 2010, was once again struck by disaster. Hurricane Matthew slammed into the country's southwestern coast with incredible force, leaving in its wake a ravaged landscape, shattered infrastructure and over 2.1 million people in need of urgent help.

Thanks to your generosity, the Canadian Red Cross sent an emergency mobile clinic and mobilized over 30 humanitarian workers within days of the disaster. Our team travelled to numerous remote villages to provide basic healthcare and offer psychological support to thousands of people affected by Matthew. Not to mention the blankets, tarps, hygiene kits, kitchen supplies and other essentials we distributed to more than 2,000 households.

In the months that followed, in partnership with the Haitian Red Cross, our staff assessed local needs and identified services required to support the recovery of populations living in affected areas. Priorities included rehabilitating local health posts damaged by the hurricane and training volunteers from affected communities to enhance the delivery and quality of medical care at these village clinics. Training and empowering communities is an important aspect of recovery, in which the Red Cross is committed to investing.

All of the work accomplished to date would not have been possible without your kind contribution. For those affected by Matthew, your support means a return to normal life — or as close to it as possible — and the ability to better cope with daily life and all the challenges it may bring. Thanks to your generosity, impacted communities can look forward to a brighter tomorrow.

Community-driven **livelihoods projects,** such as a women's cooperative that manages a community garden and sells its produce
